# Building & By-law Department Building Section Bulletin to Contractors & Builders

Subject:

Occupational Health & Safety Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. 0.1 and Regulations for Construction Projects, O. Reg. 213/91

Please take note that to ensure the safety of the city's Building Inspectors, the City of Burlington has implemented procedures regarding hazardous conditions at building sites. Inspectors have been directed not to enter onto a project site where they observe site conditions that could lead to their personal injury.

When an inspector chooses not to enter a project site, they will provide written documentation to the person in charge of the site, stating the reason(s) for their decision. A copy of the document will be submitted to the Manager of Building Inspections. The contractor will be required to correct the condition and then recall the inspector for the appropriate building code inspection. The inspection will then be conducted within the time required under the City's Building Permit By-law. The contractor must not permit the work to be covered until an inspector has reviewed the construction.

Hazards involving excavations can lead to serious incidents, including cave-ins. All parties (e.g. Constructor, owner) involved in an excavation must ensure they are familiar with and compliant with Part III of Ont. Reg. 213/91 for Construction Projects, under the Occupational Health and Safety Act. Even where workers are not present, property/home owners should ensure the precautions included in the above-mentioned regulation are met. For more information on safety requirements among workers and visitors onto a construction project involving excavation(s), refer to the Ministry of Labour, Training and Skills Development's "Excavation Hazards" fact sheet.
